





























It's almost summer time in Kessler Plaza...just a month away! With that brings hot temperatures and kids out of school for the summer!

We have lots of great stuff coming our way this summer! First off, we have our next neighborhood meeting on a special night, Tuesday, June 6th, starting at 7:00 PM. Our guest speakers will be Dwayne Jones with **Preservation Dallas and Raphael** Arredondo with the Guardian Angels. Dwayne will be discussing our options as a neighborhood to provide for a conservation district. Raphael will be discussing what we can do to reduce crime in our neighborhood and possible volunteer opportunities. It should make for an interesting meeting. I really would like to see each of you there and take a vested interest in the future of our neighborhood and community.

Coming in July, we will be having our very first 4th of July Parade for Kids and a Pooch Parade. Uncle Sam and Lady Liberty are to be possible guest stars at the parade! Then we are into the August month for National Night Out on August 1st. The police and fire departments should be on hand as well as the K-9 Unit!! I hear that the Guardian Angels will be there as well. We will have hot dogs and sodas as always. So...let's get ready and bring all the kids for what will be another fun summer!

Now a little update on what is happening around our neighborhood:

**Stop Signs**—Several neighbors have gotten together to gather signatures for 4-way stop signs at four intersections (two along Plymouth and two along Franklin). We have almost completed the two-thirds requirement to get the stop signs

installed. We have just a couple of streets left to get signatures. I would look to have the stop signs installed by early this fall!

Wine Event—I am proud to say that our first wine event fundraiser for the year netted the neighborhood close to \$975. That is awesome and I am very proud of our neighbors, friends, and sponsors for making this event a success! The Events committee is planning another one for Saturday, September 30th. So mark your calendars now!!

#### **Plymouth Greenbelt Median**

**Project**—We are in the process of applying for grant money and matching funds from the Oak Cliff Conservation League and the City of Dallas *Mowmentum* program. We will be installing irrigation, large rocks, walking trails, trees, shrubs, flowers, benches, trash receptacles, and neighborhood signage throughout the five medians between Jefferson Blvd and Moss Park. Each median will be done in phases and designated as its own project! It will take a couple years to complete the entire project but we hope to start the dirt flying during the winter months and have the first phase completed by June 2007. It is going to cost a LOT of money...probably well over \$50,000 to complete this entire project.

We need your help and donations! We hope to get several thousands of dollars in grants and matching money but it will not cover all the cost. So, please support your neighborhood and give generously when you can. We will continue to have fundraiser events so any new exciting ideas to assist are always welcomed.

Non-Profit Status—The neighborhood is in the process of working with the Oak Cliff Conservation League to obtain a nonprofit status through an umbrella policy that the league is trying to establish. We will continue to update you as soon as it comes to reality. Hopefully within the next couple of months...so all your donations can be tax deductible based on the rules governing through the IRS.

# Safeguard Your Home While on Vacation

It's summer vacation time again, and many residents will be enjoying vacations. Before leaving, take a few precautions that can help safeguard your home while you are away.

- Strive to make your home look as lived-in as possible while you're away.
- Let one of your neighbors know that you are going to be away so that they can keep an eye on your home for you. Give them a spare key to your home and an emergency telephone number to reach you.
- Arrange to have your mail and newspapers either stopped or picked up daily.
- Have your neighbor remove any flyers or advertisements that are left on your front door.
- Ask your neighbor to occasionally park in your driveway. If you are leaving a vehicle parked outside, have the neighbor move it periodically so it looks as though you are home.
- Use automatic timers to turn on a radio and lights at different intervals to hide the fact you aren't home.
- Turn down the ringer on the telephone. An unanswered telephone is a dead give-away.
   Don't indicate you are on vacation on your answering machine message.
- Leave your blinds like you normally would if you were home.
   Only close them all the way if that is what you would normally do.
- Have someone mow your yard or rake the leaves so your house looks lived-in.
- Be sure to close and lock the garage as well as any storage sheds, gates, etc.


